

CARLISLE CONSERVATIONIST OF THE YEAR AWARD

The criteria suggested by the Commission for nominees for the Conservationist Award include, but are not necessarily limited to, the following consideration of:

- upholding the values of conservation of our natural resources
- having a record of service and consistent identification with some aspect of environmental management, including, but not limited to, the development and care of trails, parks, and passive recreation areas
- having demonstrated or suggested strategies to bring about the preservation of open space areas in keeping with the total and long-range planning of the town or of the town's Open Space Plan
- having worked in communicating and interpreting environmental values
- having encouraged and participated in educational programs about the environment, wildlife flora and fauna, through our schools, camps, youth organizations, cooperative extension, and community organizations; field and forest studies are included in the broad Award criteria
- having worked toward the use and understanding of appropriate alternatives in biological and organic controls for pests, weeds, and fertilization materials
- may have distinguished himself or herself in conservation service generally as a member of a Commission, Board, or Committee of the Town or other publicly oriented group

Such nominee may have served in conservation capacities that extend beyond the local community
